Show Rules & Regulations

1. Proston Show is conducted subject to the regulations of Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Shows (QCAS), Biosecurity Queensland, the Constitution and Rules of this Association and any Regulations which apply to individual sections.
2. The Association will not, under any circumstances, hold itself responsible for any accident, loss, damage or mis-delivery of livestock or any other exhibit which may occur at any time covered by Show activity, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Association blameless and indemnify it against any cost or action, legal or otherwise arising through any accident, loss, damage, or mis-delivery. All care will be taken but no responsibility accepted.
3. It is the responsibility of Exhibitors and Space Hirers to comply with the current Workplace Health and Safety Act together with all State and Local Government Regulations and space hirers must have their own Public Liability Insurance and produce identification when requested.
4. All persons entering the Showgrounds during any period covered by Association activities shall abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Proston Show Association and will pay admission on Show Day unless issued with an approved Show Association pass.
5. The President, or Steward in Charge of any section of the Show has the discretionary right to refuse an entry by an Exhibitor any time, without expressing reason.
6. The Association reserves the right to refuse entry to any Stall Holder if the Association reasonably believes it is necessary to do so to ensure that the standard, quality, and safety of the Show is maintained.
7. To comply with the Association's insurance requirements, ALL incidents must be reported to the President or Secretary who will complete an incident Form.
8. During any period covered by Show activities, all Livestock must be the responsibility of the Owner or Owners representative.
9. Livestock Stewards have the right to arrange for the removal from the grounds, at the owner's expense, of any beast found to be diseased, dangerously uncontrollable, or otherwise unfit for the purposes of Exhibition. Any objections or protests should be submitted to the Secretary in writing for consideration at the next General Committee meeting of the Association.

Cattle Tick Rules & Regulations

All livestock entering the Proston Showgrounds must be free from visible cattle ticks. Any livestock seen to be carrying ticks should be reported to the stewards of the relevant section. The chief stewards and the President retain the right to ask any exhibitor of tick-infested cattle to leave the grounds.

Proston PA&H Association has an approved spray facility located within the Proston Showgrounds. There is an approved tick control officer and equipment available to undertake required treatments for livestock exhibited on their return movement to the property origin.

To be eligible you will need to produce a National Vendor Declaration (Cattle) & Waybill demonstrating that the destination property for the livestock in question is within the cattle tick free zone, as declared by the Queensland Department of Agriculture & Fisheries (DAF).

The Association will also provide cattle tick certification on show day. Under no circumstances will the approved persons provide spraying and/or certification to livestock unless all conditions have been satisfied.

An alternative is for any person who has undertaken an approved awareness course, to treat their own stock. These people will be permitted to utilise the facilities at the grounds.

Any stock not meeting these requirements will be required to be treated by a permanent inspector at a clearance centre.

School Agricultural Teams: Nominations close 7 days prior to the show – Friday March 1st, 2024. School teams have been exempted from competition entry fees and are able to exhibit livestock without charge.

SECTION 3: STUD CATTLE

ENTRY CONDITIONS

All exhibitors must pay gate fee. Everyone on showgrounds must have a wristband.

1. All broad ribbon prize winners must take part in the Grand Parade
2. No traffic movement until the conclusion of the Grand Parade
3. Exhibitors are required, under the National Livestock Identification System (NLIS), to make sure all cattle coming onto the showgrounds carry an approved NLIS device (ear tag or bolus). Cattle that do not have an NLIS device will be turned away
4. Exhibitors must provide a National Vendor Declaration & Waybill upon entry to the showgrounds. Cattle that are not registered on a Waybill will be turned away
5. All cattle must be free of visible ticks. Cattle will be sprayed if returning to clean country
6. Age of cattle to be taken from the day of the show
7. In the event of any dispute, the decision of the Chief Steward will be final
8. All cattle over four (4) months must have appropriate nose grips and all bulls 12 months and over must have a nose ring
9. All animals must bear a brand, either tattooed (in ear) or fire.
10. All stock MUST be always in the charge of exhibitor or representative
11. Judging in Stud Classes to be based on merits of the animal for breeding purposes

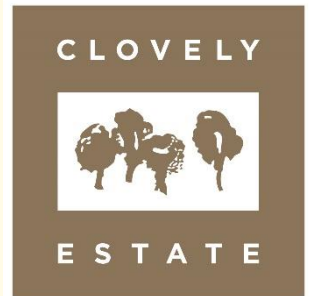
